AN ORDINANCE OF THE VILLAGE OF CHANNAHON PROVIDING FOR TEMPORARY RELIEF FROM THE VILLAGE OF CHANNAHON CODE OF ORDINANCES WITH RESPECT TO OUTDOOR DINING, ALCOHOL CONSUMPTION AND SALES AND SETTING FORTH INTERIM REGULATIONS TO GOVERN THESE MATTERS

WHEREAS, due to the COVID-19 Pandemic, the Governor has issued various Orders with respect to operation of various businesses throughout the State; and

WHEREAS, the Governor has, or will, issue another Executive Order which permits the outdoor sale of food and alcohol at restaurants and bars; and

WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of the Village to allow restaurants and bars to commence outdoor operations within the “Guidelines” hereafter set forth; and

WHEREAS, it is further in the best interest of the Village to adopt the Guidelines hereafter set forth and to allow temporary relief from various ordinances of the Village.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PRESIDENT AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF CHANNAHON, WILL AND GRUNDY COUNTIES, ILLINOIS, IN THE EXERCISE OF ITS HOME RULE, STATUTORY AND OTHER POWERS, AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. GUIDELINES

The “Guidelines” set forth on Exhibit A attached hereto are hereby adopted and incorporated into this ordinance.

SECTION 2. PENALTY

A violation of these Guidelines shall be an ordinance violation subject to the general penalty provisions of the Code of Ordinances or may be resolved through a compliance ticket with a fine of \$100.00 per violation. Each day a violation exists shall be a separate violation.

SECTION 3. PERMIT REVOCATION

Any permit issued pursuant to the Guidelines may be revoked by the Mayor based upon a violation of the Guidelines after providing the permittee with an opportunity to be heard.

SECTION 4. LIQUOR LICENSE

Additionally, a violation of the Guidelines may result in the suspension, revocation or fine pursuant to the provisions set forth in Chapter 111 (Alcoholic Beverages) of the Village Code of Ordinances.

SECTION 5. SEVERABILITY

This Ordinance and every provision thereof shall be considered severable, and the invalidity of any section, clause, paragraph, sentence, or provision of this Ordinance shall not affect the validity of any other portion of this Ordinance.

SECTION 6. REPEALER

All ordinances or parts of ordinances conflicting with any provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed.

SECTION 7. EFFECTIVE DATE

This Ordinance shall be effective after its passage, approval and publication in pamphlet form.
